

Nursery Fees

From the 1st April 2024 fees for nursery sessions will be as follows:

Daily Fees

- Full Day 8am-6pm £53.00
- Short Day £48.00
- Half Day 8am-1pm £37.00

A minimum of 2 sessions must be booked per week.

Nursery Education Funded only sessions will incur a charge of £10.00 per day to cover the cost of meals, snacks and consumables not covered by the funding.

Sibling discount of 10% will be applied to the child with the lower fees. Discount will not be applied to Nursery Education funded only places.

Nursery fees are not refundable for absences due to illness and holidays taken outside of our annual close downs.

Late Collection Charge

A fee of £10.00 will be charged every 10 minutes following the child's end of session unless prior notice has been given and agreed with the nursery manager. Please see policy document on late collection.

Fees are due within 7 days of invoice in advance.

Accounts must be settled by the end of each month, failure to do so will result in the child's place not necessarily being held open for the following month. Outstanding fees at the end of each month will incur a £30.00 administration charge for each outstanding month as at the 1st of each month.

Lost Invoices will incur a £10.00 administration fee.

Cancellation

We ask that you provide on months' notice in writing of your intention to cancel your child's place. Nursery Education funding places should please provide us with a term's notice in writing. We reserve the right to charge where insufficient notice is given.
